


Our condolences to John H. Cogswell, our Treasurer, for the loss of his mother, Lucy Antoinette (McCordy) Cogswell, who died September 25, 1995. She was born August 18, 1911. John's father was John Waite Cogswell, born April 24, 1910, died December 1, 1979. Both are buried in Hanover, New Hampshire. Due to his mother's death, John was not able to be with us at Old Saybrook as he had planned. Our regrets are, therefore, twofold: for him, the loss of his mother, and for us, the loss of not having his very pleasant personality with us at the reunion.

EIGHTH GENERATION

Harvey Cogswell-(1576), son of Elisha and Phebe Reddington Cogswell was born March 22nd, 1799, in Wilton, New York, He married August 1828 Esther Susan Mouzon, daughter of Charles and Susan (McClellan) Mouzon. She was born February 15th, 1805, in Charleston, SC where they resided. Mr. Cogswell died January 14th, 1873. Mrs. Cogswell died February 24th, 1877. To this marriage there were two children, Julia, who married Benjamin F. Evans, and Harvey, who married Mary Keller.

HAMLIN E. COGSWELL: B. 9/26/1852. Tuscarora, now Silvara, in Bradford County, PA. Lived in Brooklyn, PA, Scranton & Tunkhannock, PA, Binghamton, Eimira, & Syracuse, NY, and Washington, D.C. where he died April 7, 1922. Am seeking any connection to Cogswell's in America.

ROBERT COGSWELL: ca 1640, New Haven Colony, (Connecticut), in command of a ketch or bark to sail to Delaware. Another source records Robert Cogswell sailed from Connecticut for the (Smith or South) River and built a (looks like 'trading post') at what is now Salem, NJ. He is not listed in Jameson. Any knowledge of this Robert Cogswell will be greatly appreciated.

TRYPHENA COGSWELL: Born 1781-83, Vermont or New York? M'd. William MARTIN, June 17, 1808, NY. She died March 22, 1856 Bureau Co., IL, buried Follett Cemetery near Manlius, IL. He died April 1, 1834, at or near Lee Center, NY. They had nine children, five of whom survived to adulthood. Jameson's Cogswell's in America lists TRYPHENA'S father as JOHN COGSWELL (#525, P. 261). Old family papers list her mother as Tryphena, last name uncertain. Some sources say SPURRIER, or SPIKE, others, TOLES or TOLD. Where and when were John and Tryphena married?
